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SEC End-of-Life Objectives

- ESM of toxic constituents
- Resource conservation
 - Extending life through donation
 - Reintroducing materials into commerce
- Regulatory compliance



Program Requirements Checklist



Establish a policy, directive, memorandum, &/or guidance requiring environmentally sound management of electronic equipment at end-of life.



Establish policy, directive, memorandum &/or guidance promoting internal reuse, reuse within another state agency, & donation to regional/local agencies or non-profits (in that order) as preferred disposition methods.



Develop & maintain system for tracking units of used electronic equipment reused internally, transferred to other state agencies, donated, sent for reuse/recycling, or sent for disposal. Document each equipment transfer.



Provide recipients of donated equipment with <u>proper instructions</u> on how to manage equipment in environmentally sound manner at end-of-life.



Use a recycler that demonstrates adherence to environmentally sound management practices OR conduct physical on-site reviews or other due diligence assessments of all recycling & processing facilities that your organization uses at least every 3 years.
